This pulse survey on changes in U.S. domestic relocation programs and activity is based on data collected in May 2010. Of the 864 Corporate/Government member organizations invited to participate in the online survey, 165 responded—a 19 percent response rate. Data pertains to employees relocated domestically within the U.S.
